

DATA FOR **PROGRESS**

From February 23 to March 2, 2021, Data for Progress conducted a survey of 866 likely voters in New York using web panel respondents. The sample was weighted to be representative of likely voters by age, gender, education, race, and voting history. The survey was conducted in English. The margin of error is ± 3 percentage points.

N=866 unless otherwise specified. Some values may not add up to 100 due to rounding.

[1] Some New York lawmakers are proposing a bill that would put a tax on corporate polluters. An estimated \$15 billion raised per year from this tax would be used to invest in new renewable energy projects, community sustainability initiatives, and fossil fuel workers impacted by the transition to clean energy.
